In Reference (1), we issued a draft evaluation report on the subject topic. By Reference (2) you addressed the staff's concerns in the following three areas: (a) flooding effects due to failure of moderate energy lines, (b) postulated pipe breaks in the penetration areas, and (c) the calculation of jet impingement loads used in Reference (3).

We have reviewed your response to Item (a) in Reference (2) and found it acceptable. However, we have not received your responses to Items (b) and (c). Therefore, we conclude that the plant is adequately protected from the dynamic effects of pipe break outside containment subject to resolution of the Items (b) and (c) above in the Integrated Plant Safety Assessment.

The need to actually implement changes as a result of these items will be determined during the integrated safety assessment. This safety evaluation may be revised in the future if your facility design is changed or if NRC criteria relating to this topic are modified before the integrated assessment is completed.
