FLORIDA POWER CORPORATION NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-302/94-01 RESPONSE TO EXERCISE WEAKNESS

EXERCISE WEAKNESS 50-302/94-01-02

Onsite accountability of personnel within the protected area was not completed within approximately 30 minutes.

RESPONSE

The exercise weakness was primarily due to a misunderstanding by security personnel as to the requirements for determining accountability. Individuals were not only identified as being missing, but were then physically located as well before accountability was announced as complete. Contributing to the delay was unanticipated computer process printer time requirements. This equipment had not previously been utilized in this capacity.

A procedural change has been made to Emergency Plan Implementing Procedure EM-205, "Emergency Assembly, Evacuation, and Accountability of Personnel Within the Protected Area" that clarifies the definitions and requirements for onsite accountability. Additionally, a computer software change will be incorporated to reduce both printer operation time and hard copy review time. This software enhancement will be incorporated into the Security Computer by August 31, 1994.
