The NRC has sent to the Office of the Federal Register for publication the enclosed final amendment to the Commission's rules in 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix E. Experience has shown that the requirements in 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix E, Section IV.F.3 on full or partial participation by State or local governments in the biennial (offsite) exercise are unnecessarily complicated.<sup>7</sup> Additionally, the Commission believes that: (1) the interval for an ingestion exposure pathway exercise should be changed from 5 to 6 years, and (2) the requirement that all states within the plume exposure pathway emergency planning zone of a given site fully participate in an offsite exercise for that site at least once every 7 years should be deleted.

These emergency planning exercise revisions will make NRC regulations consistent with FEMA's exercise requirements.
