SUBJECT: MEDICAL CONSULTANTS

The NRC has extended the appointment of Drs. Reynold Brown, Belton Burrows, James Maxfield, Eugene Saenger, George Thoma and Neil Wald to serve as medical consultants to the Office of Inspection and Enforcement. Their appointments are from July 1, 1977 through June 30, 1978.

These consultants can provide the following type of assistance to IE:

1. Furnish medical advice pertaining to possible radiation effects upon NRC licensees, their employees or members of the public;
2. Furnish testimony at inquiries or hearing as a medical expert; and
3. Participate in selected conferences on effects of radiation and radioactive materials upon human beings.

However, their activities must be restricted to avoid any tasks which might result in a conflict-of-interest with NRC activities. Enclosed are the OGC reviews of each medical consultant's confidential statement of employment and financial interests. This review lists organizations having a possible conflict-of-interest with the NRC if the consultant participated in matters affecting these organizations.





Please accept my apologies for not having responded sooner to your letter dated December 7, 1982, in which you are questioning reimbursement of your consulting services for the period April 7 through June 11, 1982.

Services for the above period were performed under Contract No: AT-(49-24)-1023, Modification #20, effective July 1, 1981 through June 30, 1982, at a rate of \$170 per day. A Form NRC 50, "Notification of Personnel Action" was issued to you under letter dated November 16, 1981, from Judy A. Langan, Division of Organization and Personnel. You indicated acceptance of this contract by signing the letter on November 26, 1981, and returning it to the Personnel Office. This contract is, therefore, the document under which a voucher for reimbursement was prepared and which you signed on November 3, 1982. //
