SUBJECT: ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT NO.166 TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE NO. NPF-1, PHYSICAL SECURITY PLAN, TROJAN NUCLEAR PLANT (TAC NO. 73381)

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 166 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-1 for the Trojan Nuclear Plant. The amendment consists of changes to the Trojan Nuclear Plant Security Plan, and a license condition to implement the provisions of the Security Plan. This is in response to your application (LCA-170) dated October 7, 1988, supplemented by letter dated December 23, 1988.

The amendment revises the Security Plan by allowing the use of dedicated observers in lieu of security officers to compensate for certain safeguards degradations. The amendment also describes the conformance to the Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 73.55(c)(6) by making changes in the control room floor.

Our evaluation of the amendment to your Physical Security Plant for the Trojan Nuclear Plant is contained in the Safeguards Evaluation Report which, since it contains safeguards information, is withheld from public disclosure under the provisions of 10 CFR 73.21. Based on this evaluation, we find that you meet the requirements of the Miscellaneous and Search Requirements revision to 10 CFR 73.55 and the recordkeeping requirements of 10 CFR 73.70.

We find that this amendment to your license is related solely to safeguards matters and does not involve any significant construction impacts. Accordingly, this amendment meets the eligibility criteria for categorical exclusion set forth in 10 CFR 51.22(c)(12). Pursuant to 10 CFR 51.22(b), no environmental impact statement or environmental assessment need be prepared in connection with the issuance of this amendment.

Based on the fact that this license amendment applies to the Physical Security Plan and incorporates into the license the latest requirements of your updated Physical Security Plan, we have concluded that there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action and that this action will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations, and the issuance of this

amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

The notice of issuance will be included in the Commission's next regular biweekly Federal Register notice.
