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I understand that the Charter will be finalized during the Committee's initial meeting(s). I support this approach since the interests and expertise of the Committee members can be brought to bear on the draft Charter and the comments received thereon. Toward that end, I offer the following comments and recommendations on the draft Charter:

- The proposed Committee membership as shown in the draft Charter includes representatives of only Regions II and III. In view of the safeguards-related experiences of the other Regions, especially Regions I and V, I suggest that all the Regions be represented on the Committee in an equal capacity. If member representatives of all five Regions would make the Committee unwieldy, I recommend that a representative of the Deputy Executive Director for Regional Operations and Generic Requirements serves as a member of the Committee and represent and coordinate the interests of all the Regions.
- 2. Attachment A to the draft Charter shows that the Committee's report will be issued by March 31, 1983. I recommend that the type of report envisioned, e.g., Commission Paper, NUREG, etc., be specified in the Charter; that consideration be given to the role envisioned

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for the Committee for the Review of Generic Requirements, if any, in the review of the report; and that the report completion date be set only after balancing the relative priority and resource requirements of this effort with the other efforts of the Agency.

Attachment A to the draft Charter shows that questions may be developed and published for public comment along with the insider package. I recommend that this approach or any other approach be agreed upon only after consideration is given to the need to complete this effort in a timely manner; the expected costs and benefits of soliciting written public comments, soliciting only written industry comments, or meeting with industry representatives to discuss their views; and the potential advantages and disadvantages of coupling a request for comments on the questions with a request for comments on the insider package.
