SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT 030-12750/94-01; 030-15184/94-01

This refers to the routine, unannounced inspection conducted by Mr. Gilbert L. Guerra, Jr., of this office on April 11-13, 1994. The inspection included a review of activities authorized by Byproduct Materials Licenses 35-03176-04MD and 35-03176-05. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with members of your staff.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under the license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and the conditions of the license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews of personnel, independent measurements, and observation of activities in progress.

No violations or deviations were identified; therefore, no response to this letter is required.

The inspector noted that the radiation safety office had continued to implement its aggressive audit program for activities conducted under these two licenses. As is evident by the results of this inspection, such an auditing program is beneficial in maintaining licensed activities in compliance.

While observing activities in the nuclear pharmacy the inspector noted that daily operations such as order receipt, dose preparation, quality control checks, and shipment preparation were properly performed and were appropriately documented.

Also, the inspector toured the waste storage and incinerator areas associated with the waste management license. He discussed waste handling procedures with your staff, specifically how decay-in-storage and incineration operations

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have been handled. He concluded that appropriate procedures and controls had been instituted in maintaining effluents and doses as low as reasonably achievable (ALARA).
