SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT CONFERENCE REGARDING NRC INSPECTION REPORT 99900271/93-01

This letter is in reply to the Rosemount Nuclear Instruments, Incorporated (Rosemount). March 23, 1994. letter to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) regarding Rosemount's proposed schedule for response to NRC Inspection Report 99900271/93-01. issued March 4, 1994. This letter also addresses concerns identified in the Inspection Report and confirms matters discussed with Mr. Kenneth Ewald of your staff on April 18 and April 21, 1994.

Your letter requested that the Enforcement Conference to discuss the apparent violation of 10 CFR Part 21 contained in the subject NRC report be conducted in early August 1994. We believe Rosemount has extensive information on this matter, and that an earlier date would still afford Rosemount sufficient time to prepare for the Enforcement Conference. Scheduling the conference for August 1994, as proposed by Rosemount, would impose an undue delay in the resolution of this matter. During our phone conversations with Mr. Ewald, we proposed that an earlier date for the conference be chosen. As a result of those discussions, an Enforcement Conference at our White Flint office has been scheduled for June 23, 1994, at 8:45 a.m.

The Enforcement Conference will be closed to the public in accordance with Commission policy because Rosemount proprietary information and investigative matters will be discussed. We intend to transcribe the Enforcement Conference and prepare a summary to be made publicly available after a final determination on enforcement action has been made and proprietary and investigative considerations are addressed.

Additionally, it was noted that the Office of Investigations' (01) report synopsis that was provided to you as Enclosure 4, to our March 4, 1994, letter did not adequately characterize the first conclusion. The conclusion set forth in the body of the OI report is:

Based on the documentary and testimonial evidence developed during the investigation, it is concluded that RM provided inaccurate and incomplete information to the NRC on April 13, 1989, regarding the failure experience of the RM 1152 transmitter. However, the investigation did not substantiate that was a deliberate act on the part of Rosemount.

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The foregoing quote should therefore replace the first sentence of the second paragraph of OI Case No. 4-90-009 Synopsis. You are requested to be prepared to discuss this matter at the Enforcement Conference, as well as those items specified in our March 4, 1994, letter. If Rosemount prefers to waive participation in an NRC Enforcement Conference, the NRC staff will process this matter in accordance with NRC policy and inform Rosemount of its final conclusions when they are available.
