

Dear Mr. Gillen:



As you are aware, the tailings cells at White Mesa are formed by excavating a huge volume of material, and then building a containment dike on the downstream side of the excavated cell. Therefore, it is possible to discharge a considerable volume of tailings which can be contained below grade, creating no head on the dike itself.

Discharging of tailings up to this amount bears no relevance to safety matters connected with the dike itself, or with the downstream safety dike. In other words, it is not conceivable that a dam break could occur and release tailings as long as tailings are held below grade.

Specifically, Energy Fuels requests permission to utilize Cell 3 for storage of tailings in the absence of a downstream safety dike. During the period of such storage, tailing solution will be kept below grade level so as to allay any concern regarding downstream containment in the case of dike failure.

However, it is assumed that tailings can be stored against the dike to the extent that progressive construction of the safety dike will contain the volume of a potential

spill. The latter provision is important in that it now may be next spring (1983) before the safety dike is fully constructed.

Your prompt attention to this matter will be appreciated. A check for \$150 is enclosed to cover the fee for an administrative admendment.
