This letter is being transmitted in response to your request regarding further action to be taken on the GGNS Emergency Operating Procedures (EOPs). On June 28, 1982 MP&L submitted Revision 10 to the GGNS EOPs which incorporated General Electric comments based on the BWROG Emergency Procedure Guidelines (Rev. 1B). Your review of the EOPs has indicated that due to the changes made since the previous NRC reviewed revision, certain human factors considerations have been obscured.

Your letter of September 15, 1982 requests that MP&L take either the option of establishing a meeting between the NRC, GE and MP&L to further discuss necessary actions or to incorporate the guidance of the INPO Writers Guide and submit another revision to the GGNS EOPs. As discussed with your Mr. Jim Clifford (PTRB), MP&L has chosen to reissue the GGNS EOPs in accordance with the INPO Writers Guide along with Revision 2 of the BWROG EPGs.

The revised GGNS EOPs will be submitted for your review by October 29, 1982. If your review indicates that additional action is required, MP&L suggests that a meeting be scheduled during the week of November 1, 1982 to resolve this issue in order to maintain our full power operating license schedule.
