ESTIMATE OF LICENSEES WHICH WOULD STORE LOW-LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTE IF ACCESS TO A DISPOSAL FACILITY

IS DENIED

On February 2, 1993, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission published a proposed rulemaking in the Federal Register that would establish a regulatory framework containing the criteria and procedures that would apply to on-site storage of low-level radioactive waste (LLW) after January 1, 1996. A regulatory analysis and an Office of Management and Budget supporting statement were included in the rulemaking package. These documents addressed the impact of the proposed rule on the licensees. The impact analysis assumed that all licensees would be affected even though many licensees store only for decay or do not generate LLW on a regular basis. This assumption built a large degree of conservatism into the impact assessment. We are currently preparing the final rulemaking package and your assistance in developing a more realistic estimate is requested.

To support our rulemaking schedule, the information identified on the enclosure is requested by June 30, 1993.
