Gentlemen:

On August 21, 1990, the U.S. Department of Labor's (DOL) Wage and Hour Division in Fort Worth received a complaint from a former employee of Nuclear Support Services, Inc., a TU Flectric contractor at the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station (CPSES). DOL's receipt of this complaint was documented in an August 21, 1990, letter to M. D. Spence of TU Electric. The former employee alleged that she had been terminated from her position because she had raised safety concerns while performing her duties at CPSES. In response to that complaint, the Wage and Hour Division conciliated an agreement between the parties. On September 21, 1990, DOL's Fort Worth office was mailed a copy of a check that was issued to the complainant to settle the matter.

While we recognize that TU Electric's contractor appears to have settled its differences with this individual, NRC must review this matter to determine whether a violation of 10 CFR 50.7 may have occurred. Such a violation, if it occurred, could have a chilling effect on other licensee or contractor personnel in that it might deter them from identifying any nuclear safety related concerns they may have.

Therefore, you are requested to provide this office, within 30 days of the date of this letter, a response which:

- Provides the basis for the employment action regarding this former contractor employee, referenced in the complaint filed with DOL, and includes a copy of or synopsis of any investigation reports you have regarding the circumstances of the action; and
- Describes the actions, if any, taken or planned to assure that this
 matter does not have a chilling effect in discouraging other licensee or
 contractor employees from raising perceived safety concerns.
