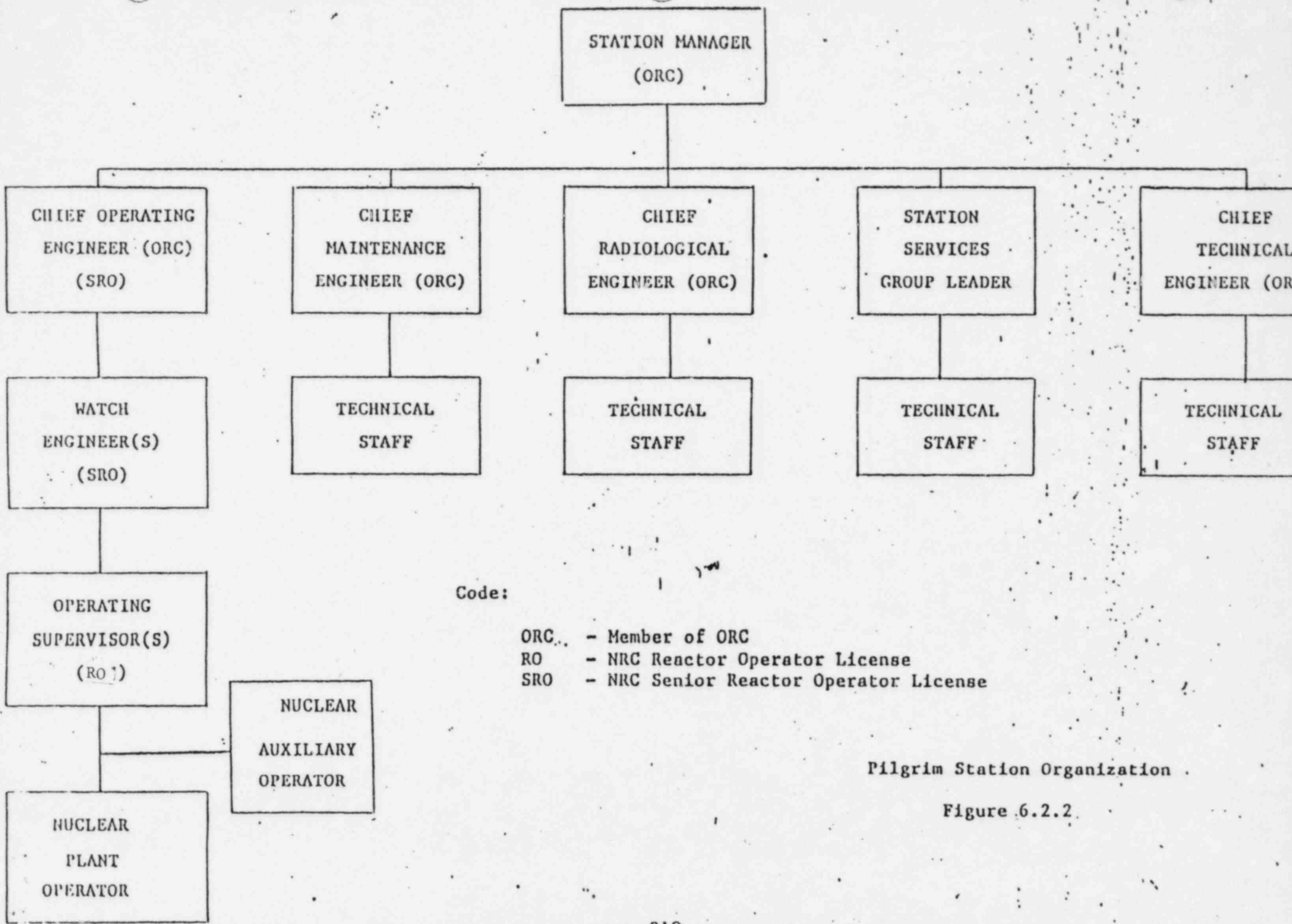

The following paragraphs are intended to clarify the functional and administrative responsibilities of the fire protection organization.

Brigade Leader

During a fire emergency the Fire Brigade Leader reports directly to the Station Manager or Emergency Director. The Fire Brigade Leader assumes overall direction of the Fire Fighting effort and directs personnel at the scene of the fire. Fire Brigade Leaders are qualified in accordance with the training requirements stipulated in the PNPS Training Manual. The Fire Prevention and Protection Officer can assume the position of Brigade Leader if he deems necessary. The position of Brigade Leader may be designated to any qualified individual.

FPPO

The Fire Prevention and Protection Officer reports on a functional basis to the Station Manager and on an administrative basis to the Nuclear Operations Support Manager. On a functional basis the Fire Prevention and Protection Officer is responsible to insure that routine operation, maintenance and surveillance testing of fire protection systems and fire brigade response is being implemented properly. On an administrative basis the FPPO is responsible for evaluating fire protection adequacy, assisting in fire protection training, and reviewing and implementing fire protection administrative controls.

The proposed change to Section 6.2.B.6 is as follows:

6. A Fire Brigade of five members including the Brigade Leader shall be maintained on the site at all times. This excludes three members of the minimum shift crew necessary for safe shutdown and any personnel required for other essential functions during a fire emergency.
