Gentlemen:

This refers to the routine, unannounced radiation safety inspection conducted by Mr. Selvan Rajendran and Ms. Billie Gruszynski of this office on August 15-17, 1990, of activities authorized by NRC Byproduct Material License Nos. 42-00220-06 and 42-00220-08, and to the discussion of our findings held by the inspectors with members of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under the licenses as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and the conditions of the licenses. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews of personnel, independent measurements, and observations by the inspectors. The inspectors noted that the radiation safety program for the nuclear medicine and teletherapy departments appeared to be adequately managed by the radiation safety officer (RSO). The research area showed some improvements since the last inspection, but the program needs to be improved even further in order to ensure that all aspects of the radiation safety program are met. The inspectors noted that current radiation safety staffing may be inadequate for a program of your size.

During this inspection, certain of your activities were found not to be conducted in full compliance with NRC requirements. Consequently, you are required to respond to this matter in writing, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.201 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2. Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations. Your response should be based on the specifics contained in the Notice of Violations enclosed with this letter.

The inspectors also reviewed actions you had taken with respect to the violations observed during our previous inspection conducted on August 29-30, 1989. They verified that corrective actions for the violations had been implemented as stated in your replies dated November 14 and December 28, 1989. However, they noted that Violation C has recurred since the previous inspection. This item is identified as Violation 1 in Appendix A.
