This system had not been operational during the last operating cycle and part of the previous operating cycle. At the time of our response, the date given was deemed to be reasonable and achievable. However, numerous problems have developed as repairs and testing commenced. Many of the system's problems could not be identified until known problems were repaired and testing commenced. The present status of the system is such that continuous operation is not possible for two reasons: We are unable to establish flow through the dryer purge line. This 1) flow is necessary for maintaining the dryers in a regenerated condition to allow use of the charcoal beds. Leakage of noble gases from the system is such that normal occupancy of the turbine building is not possible without personnel contamination by the short-lived particulate isotopes. To resolve these problems and any other problems which may not yet be identified, a "technical task force" comprised of plant engineers has been formed.
