SUBJECT: Grand Gulf Recirculation Pump Shaft Crack (Reference PNO-11-90-79)
On December 18, 1990, following an increase in vibration on the ' $B$ ' Recirculation Pump, the reactor was shutdown. The licensee disassembled the ' $B$ ' pump and discovered that the shaft had a 150 degree circumferential thru-wall crack. The licensee is investigating the cause of the shaft crack. The ' $A$ ' recirculation pump shaft was disassembled and inspected, no cracks were detected. The licensee is working closely with Perry (BWR 6 with similar Recirculation Pumps) to identify any differences in the mode of operations of these pumps. Perry does not use a seal purge and their ATWS trip setpoint logic is different. Entergy is evaluating these differences. The licensee replaced both pump shafts. The plant restarted December 30, 1990, and tied onto the grid December 31, 1990.
