AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

The United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has granted the request of the Boston Edison Company (the licensee) to withdraw its November 8, 1990 application for proposed amendment to Facility Operating License No. DPR-35 for the Pilgrim Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1, located in the town of Plymouth, Plymouth County, Massachusetts.

The proposed amendment would have revised the technical specifications to upgrade the Safety Limit Minimum Critical Power Ratio and revised the Operating Limit Minimum Critical Power Ratio of the technical specifications.


The Commission has previously issued a Notice of Consideration of Issuance of Amendment published in the FEDERAL REGISTER on December 12, 1990 (55 FR 51175). However, by letter dated January 4, 1991, the licensee withdrew the proposed change.
