DRAFT LETTER TO ARRANGEMENT ADMINISTRATORS

I would like to bring to your attention an opportunity for one of your staff to participate in the cleanup of the Three Mile Island Unit 2.

Metropolitan Edison, the NRC licensee, is responsible for the cleanup operations, now in progress. In connection with this task, Metropolitan Edison would be willing to accept a limited number of qualified radiological health professionals to be assigned within the Met Ed staff at the site. If you have a staffer who could use such experience, and would like to send him, please let me know. Anyone you recommend should have a background as a health physicist, radio-chemist, radiological environmental monitor or other similar skills and should be available for at least six months.

*Although NRC is unable to offer financial assistance toward the salary or expenses of participants in this program, I am confident that we could help to arrange for support with the IAEA Fellowship Program, at least for nominees of the less developed countries.

**Unfortunately, we are unable to offer financial assistance toward the salary or expenses of assignees. All costs would be at the expense of the parent employer organization.
