SUMMARY

On November 8, 1990, FEMA Region X evaluated an off-hours and unannounced drill at the Cowlitz County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in Kelso, Washington. The purpose of the drill was to evaluate the ability of the EOC staff to activate the Cowlitz County EOC during non work hours. This corresponds to Objective County EOC during non work hours. This corresponds to Objective 336 in FEMA's Exercise Evaluation Methodology. FEMA rule 44 CFR 350 and NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1 (as amended by GM PR-1) require that once every six years provisions be made to begin an exercise between the hours of 1800 and 0400.

Our evaluation found that Cowlitz County had the ability to alert key EOC staff and direct them to report to the EOC in a timely manner.

DRILL EVALUATION

Objective #36: Unannounced and Off-Hours Drill.

Evaluation: Met

Narrative Summary:

Cowlitz County demonstrated the ability to alert key EOC staff and direct them to report to the EOC for an unannounced drill during the time period 1800 to 0400.

The initial notification from the utility was received at the Cowlitz 911 Center at 0347. Staff were alerted by telephone from 0350 to 0357 using the Cowlitz County DEM Trojan Call list (see Table 1 for a list of key staff notified). Additional personnel were notified by staff members as appropriate. Sufficient staff had arrived at the EOC by 0420 (see Table 1) to allow the Cowlitz County Emergency Management Director to declars the EOC Operational at 0421.

At 0415 the Utility initiated a call to establish communications with the Trojan EOF, Washington State, Oregon State, Columbia County and Cowlitz County ECCs. Contact between these parties was maintained during the course of the drill. The drill was terminated at 0515.

All functions observed were in accord with the Cowlitz County Emergency plans and procedures.
