
I have two requests for documents which have been submitted to the NRC under the new decommissioning regulations which went into effect on July 27, 1988.

First, under 10 CFR §50.33(k)(2), each holder of an operating license for a production or utilization facility must submit a report by July 26, 1990 indicating how assurance will be provided that funds will be available for decommissioning. I would like a copy of each report submitted by an electric utility licensee and any sort of summary of these reports which may have been prepared. If these prove to be too voluminous, I would settle for only the report prepared by Portland General Electric for its Trojan facility and any summaries which are available.

Second, under 10 CFR §50.82, applicants for license termination must submit a decommissioning plan which includes the choice of decommissioning alternative. I would like a copy of any §50.82 plan which has been submitted to date.

I intend to use these documents in preparing a paper for a class at Lewis and Clark Law School in Portland, Oregon, where I am a third year student. The topic of this paper is the legal and economic factors which may play a discriminating role in an electric utility's choice of immediate or delayed decommissioning. Extractions from these documents will serve as the bulk of my quantitative research. Due to the educational purpose of this request, I understand that I will be charged only duplication fees. I would like to request waiver of all fees under 10 CFR §9.41. As I intend to seek publication in a law review, I believe waiving the fees will advance the public interest as it is likely to contribute to the public's understanding of the immediate versus delayed decommissioning choice.
