Gentlemen:

Please be advised that I represent an employee of a Cincinnati company who performed work on the premises of the General Electric plant at 1 Neumann Way, Cincinnati, Ohio. According to my information, this individual worked in Building D at this facility. It is my understanding that this building, during the 1960s, was used by the General Electric Company and its contractors for the purposes of experimenting with nuclear fuel to propel aircraft.

During the early to mid-1980s this building was renovated, and attempts at decontamination were undertaken. Despite these facts, my client has symptoms compatible with radiation sickness.

It is my understanding that your agency was involved in inspections and investigations at the General Electric inspections and investigations at the General Electric facility regarding the levels of radiation. Thus, I would greatly appreciate it if you would provide me any of your records, under the Freedom of Information Act, regarding records, under the Freedom of Information in Cincinnati, inspection of Building D at General Electric in Cincinnati, inspection of Building D at General Electric in Cincinnati, only interested in determining if there was air sampling for thorium or uranium directly, to determine if there was any airborne contamination in the form of particulate, and therefore concern for alpha radiation, which would not be measured by direct reading radiation monitoring (dosimeters). I am especially interested in

whether such air sampling was done during the years 1980 through 1986.
