

This letter is in reference to the unannounced safety inspection conducted by Mr. Richard A. Leonardi, Jr. on November 27, 1990. This letter is in response to the violation of the "General Statement of Policy and Procedures for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (1990).

At this point and time, January 28, 1991, our Radiation Safety Committee has met and we voted unanimously to place two physicians, Nergesh Surti, M.D. and William Graham, M.D. on our teletherapy license permitting them authorized user visiting privileges.

The hospital's administration and the radiation oncology department directors have agreed in writing to the acceptance of these two physicians. These physicians are in the formal process of gaining courtesy staff privileges at our institution. Upon the successful completion of their applications and acceptance to our courtesy staff by the Credential Committee and the Executive Committee, the physicians will be automatically accepted by this administration, Radiation Safety Committee and the Radiation Therapy Department.

We wish to comply with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's policies and procedures. These two physicians are on the teletherapy license at Oklahoma Memorial Hospital in Oklahoma City. I hope this letter of explanation will assure you that we are showing good cause in correcting this violation. Please find enclosed a copy of our policy that was presented to the Radiation Safety Committee on January 25, 1991.
