Dear Mr. Keppler:

On October 15, 1982, Detroit Edison's Mr. D. Ferencz, Acting Supervisor-Construction Quality Assurance, telephoned Mr. J. Konklin's office of NRC Region III to report on a potential problem with hydraulic pipe snubbers at the Fermi 2 site.

The problem appears to be contamination of the hydraulic fluid with metal filings and corrosion of internal parts. The hydraulic snubbers are supplied by Power Piping Company. Approximately 400 such snubbers exist at the Fermi 2 site. This problem appears to be similar to a previous one at Crystal River 3 Nuclear Plant in Florida.

Currently, all hydraulic snubbers have been sent to Power Piping for refurbishing.
