Mechanical Plugs to East Germany

Dear Mr. Hauber:

Your letter of January 9, 1991 advised that, following unification on October 3, 1990 the German Democratic Republic (GDR) ceased to exist, having been integrated into the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG). The NRC further noted that exports of nuclear reactor components to the former GDR could now be made under NRC general license in accordance with 10CFR110.26 (a) which authorizes the export of any nuclear reactor component listed in 10CFR110, Appendix A (5) through (9) for use in any light or heavy water-moderated or research reactor in any EURATOM member state, including the FRG.

Accordingly, the export of mechanical plugs for use in any light or heavy water-moderated or research reactor in the FRG is generally licensed and a specific license is no longer needed for the former GDR.

Therefore, we are withdrawing our application (XCOM-1040) for the export of 20,000 mechanical plugs to East Germany for installation in steam generators for the Nord 1, 2, 3 and 4 nuclear reactors located at Greifswald.
