

SUBJECT: LETTER FROM HUGH L. THOMPSON, NRC DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR NUCLEAR MATERIALS SAFETY, SAFEGUARDS, AND OPERATIONS SUPPORT; EA 91-089; DATED DECEMBER 30, 1991

In paragraph 3 of page 2 of the letter referred to above. clarification is asked regarding the temporary storage of Low-Level-Waste (LLW) of by-product material pending approval of the incinerator for LLW disposal. No mention was made of such plans in our Radiation Safety Improvement Plan (RSIP) since these are part of, and are described in detail, in the license documents of License No. 52-01964-07 and its amendments. Please refer to those documents for all information pertaining this matter. Also, please refer to the Medical Sciences Campus letter (addressed to you) dated September 18, 1991, regarding the fact that the resumption of byproduct material purchasing would be done on a case by case basis, in such a way that no increase in the current LLW burden is seen. Therefore, no increase in storage capacity will be needed. If you require additional information on this subject, please be sure to send a request for any specific data that you need.

When the identification of the LLW is completed (please refer to the RSIP) we will determine the need, if any, for long-term LLW storage of non-incinerable waste, and submit a plan at that time.

Most (if not all) of our LLW falls under the category of "Below Regulatory Concern". Therefore, this LLW does not represent a radiation hazard or risk that could threaten the public health in any way.

Partial approval of our application for the incinerator has been obtained. If by July 1, 1992, delays for the final approval appear to be developing due to additional administrative requirements, the Medical Sciences Campus will draft a plan for extended storage of LLW with possible amendments for increased possession limits, to comply with the NRC Information Notice No. 90-09 by the January 1, 1993, deadline.
