Re: License Modification for United Nuclear Corporation (UNC)

Dear Mr Hall:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received the draft amendment to the Source Material License SUA-1475. After reviewing the NRC draft EPA concurs with the proposed changes. For the sake of clarity the following comments are provided noting the rationale for concurring with the changes in the license conditions:

It should be mentioned that elements of License Condition 30 * have already been approved in response to UNC's request, in February 1993.

We appreciate your indication to UNC that the issues related to appropriate background water quality are deferred to EPA's current statistical evaluation of monitoring data. Also, that if a mutually satisfactory resolution of cleanup standards is not settled in a short time frame, it can be addressed under the Alternate Concentration Limit (ACL) procedure at a later date.
