Dear Mr. Congel:

Enclosed is a copy of the final exercise report for the June 9-10, 1992, exercise of the offsite radiological emergency response plans for the State of Ohio and Columbiana County site-specific to the Beaver Valley Nuclear Power Station. The State of Ohio partially participated and Columbiana County fully participated in the exercise. The enclosed report was prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region V staff and copies will be forwarded to the State of Ohio. The States of Pennsylvania and West Virginia and affected local jurisdictions also participated in the exercise. A report describing that portion of the exercise was prepared by FEMA Region III and was submitted to the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission on December 30, 1993.

There were no Deficiencies identified for the State of Ohio and Columbiana County during the June 9-10, 1992, exercise. There were, however, seven Areas Requiring Corrective Action (ARCA) identified for the State of Ohio. FEMA Region V staff will monitor the corrective actions for the ARCAs.

Based on the results of the June 9-10, 1992, exercise, the offsite radiological emergency response plans and preparedness for the State of Ohio and Columbiana County site-specific to the Beaver Valley Nuclear Power Station can be implemented and are adequate to provide reasonable assurance that appropriate measures can be taken offsite to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of a radiological emergency at the site. Therefore, the Title 44 CFR, Part 350, approval of the State of Ohio and local offsite radiological emergency response plans and preparedness site-specific to the Beaver Valley Nuclear Power Station granted on June 5, 1987, will remain in effect.
