SUBJECT: ROUTINE INSPECTION NO. 030-33249/94-001

On January 11, 1994, Steven Courtemanche and Steve Shaffer of this office conducted a routine safety inspection at your facilities in Worcester, Pennsylvania and a temporary job site in Oxford, Pennsylvania of activities authorized by the above listed NRC license. The inspection was an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspector, interviews with personnel, and a selective examination of representative records. The findings of the inspection were discussed with you at the conclusion of the inspection.

Based on the results of this inspection, it appears that your activities were not conducted in full compliance with NRC requirements. A Notice of Violation is enclosed as Appendix A and categorizes each violation by severity level in accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (Enforcement Policy). You are required to respond to this letter and in preparing your response, you should follow the instructions in Appendix A.

The NRC is concerned about the management oversight of your radiation safety program given the number of apparent violations identified during this inspection. If adequate attention and oversight of licensed activities had been provided, these violations likely would not have gone undetected until the NRC inspection. These violations demonstrate the need for the Radiation Safety Officer and management to aggressively monitor and evaluate licensed activities to assure they are conducted safely and in accordance with the terms of your license. In addition to the response required by the enclosed Notice of Violation, please describe how your organization will ensure that licensed activities are conducted in accordance with the terms of your license and how you will improve your oversight of them.

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Please use the enclosed self-addressed green envelope when you submit your copy to the Regional Administrator, Region I. This will assist us in the timely processing of your response. In accordance with Section 2.790 of NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and your reply will be placed in the Public Document Room. The responses directed by this letter and the accompanying Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, PL 96-511.

Your cooperation with us is appreciated.
