Reference is made to your application of July 2, 1962 requesting renewal of Hyproduct Material License No. 31-653-2; to our letter of August 22, 1962 listing the deficiencies in that application in light of the requirements of 10 CFR, Part 30; and to your reply of September 19, 1962.

Your reply does not contain the information which we requested in support of your renewal application, and which is required in order to issue a renewal of the license. In lieu of submitting the information required by Section 30.2h(g) of Part 30, your letter requests an extension of the license for a limited period of time on the basis of an anticipated lack of need for the licensed material after December 31, 1962. Your letter further states that, "At that time we would either dispose of the four sources on hand or if the project continues comply with A.E.C. requirements for storing and handling this material".

The requirements of the Commission's regulations in Parts 20 and 31 as they pertain to the use of scaled sources of byproduct material in radiography; and the requirements of Section 30.2b(g) of Part 30 are not predicated on the amount of time a license will be in effect, but were established on the basis of health and safety considerations. We cannot extend or re-issue your license on the basis of the information contained in your latter of September 19, 1962.

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If you propose to limit the scope of your radiography program to the use of one source of byproduct material, as stated in your letter, the information listed in our letter of August 22, 1962 may be submitted to describe a program so limited. However, the information submitted must demonstrate that the program will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of Commission regulations and your license provisions.

In order that a final determination may be made on your renewal application, the information requested above should be furnished to the Commission within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter. If adequate information is not received within this period of time, it may be necessary for the Commission to deny the application. Denial of the application would terminate the license since it remains in effect only because of your timely renewal application. Denial would also result in the issuance of an order requiring Clevite Research Center to dispose of all byproduct material authorized by license No. 31-653-2.
