Inspection Summary: Special Security Inspection Conducted on June 9, 1982, (Report Number 0-82-70). Conducted special security inspection relative to physical barriers; personnel identification and control; protective alarms; protective personnel; classified document control; security of documents in storage; security education; personnel clearance and visitor control. The inspection involved 8 inspector-hours onsite by one region-based inspector. The inspection was initiated during regular working hours.

Results: The licensee was found to be in compliance with NRC requirements in the areas inspected.

6. 92706 - Independent Inspection Effort

The Security Officer (Mr. T. B. Cochran) stated that on June 9, 1982, an individual who identified himself as Mr. Victor Kuzlov of the Arms Control Association inquired about obtaining a copy of a book titled, "Nuclear Weapons Data Book". This book was the property of NRDC and was used as the source document for an article that was published in Volume 12, No. 4 of the Arms Control Association Newsletter dated April 1982. Mr. Kozlov was advised that the book was not available.

The Security Officer learned from the Arms Control Association that Mr. Kozlov was a member of that organization. The Security Officer then notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation of the attempt to obtain the information. No further action by the inspector was deemed necessary.

2. 30703 - Exit Interview

The inspector met with the facility Security Officer at the conclusion of the inspection on June 9, 1982. At that time, the purpose and scope of the inspection were reviewed and the licensee was informed of the findings.

3. 81815 - Physical Protection Access Authorization

No violations were noted.

The inspector ascertained that the licensee had established a program for granting, reinstating, extending, transferring, and terminating authorizations for access to National Security Information, classified Confidential.

4. 81820 - Physical Protection Facility Approval for NSI

No violations were noted.

The inspector ascertained that the licensee ensured that all individuals who had a need to use, process, store, reproduce, transmit or handle Confidential information at any location in connection with Commission related activities had an NRC Security Facility Approval.

The inspector ascertained that all specifications, conditions and limits stated in the approval were observed and satisfied, and that no substantive changes in the facility operations or procedures had been effected since the issuance of the Approval, or that the licensee had been granted any exemptions to the provisions of 10 CFR Part 95.

5. 81821 - Safeguarding NSI; Storage and Use

No violations were noted.

The inspector verified that the licensee ensured that other persons with whom it conducts business and who are authorized access to NSI can securely store and safeguard this material in established Security Areas.
