Dear Debra Stuit,

This letter is a follow up to my phone call of 19 November 1990.

I was fired from my job on Feb. 1, 1990 one day after NYPA learned I am disabled (I have eplispy from a car accident in 1987). For the past nine years I worked for the New York Power Authority (NYPA).

I have found that there is a law called the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and that this law would make it a crime for NYPA to fire anyone because they are disabled. But the law is only applicalbe if NYPA has recieved federal funds, material or support. ei Grants, contracts ect.

I have hired a lawyer but everthing hinges on proving that NYPA has received federal funds, for this I need help from your office.

I am requesting that you use the resources of your office to find contracts (or grants) between NYPA the NRC. If you find that money has been provided to NYPA then I would need documentation of this.

If you can find this information I would use it to force NYPA into negotiations to get my job back.

Tips on places and things to look for

The New York Power Authority (NYPA) has two nuclear power plants, they are:

1. James A. Fitzpatrick
2. Indian Point-3

NYPA changed it's company name a few years ago before the change it was called The Power Authority of the State of New York (PASNY)

NYPA wrote a company wide procedure which called for the hiring and promoting of the handicapped back in 1985. I would guess that they only did this because they had to. So I would also guess that there was a grant or contract in around 1984 or 1985.

If you find a contract in 1984 or 85 then it is possible that the same kind of contract was repeated in later years.

I think I remeber something called a "Coorepative Aggrement" with the NRC, you might check that.
