Dear Ms. Curran:

Your October 21, 1993 letter to me expressed concern about sampling of offsite areas potentially contaminated by operations at the Sequoyah Fuels Corporation (SFC) facility near Gore, Oklahoma. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is committed to ensuring that licensees conduct complete and accurate characterization of all radiological contamination related to licensed activities. Therefore, SFC is obliged to demonstrate how they propose to sample all potentially contaminated areas surrounding the site as part of the Site Characterization Plan (SCP), which was be submitted to the NRC by letter dated January 31, 1994. Your concern will be addressed during our review of that SCP. Before NRC approval of the Plan, SFC must present an adequate sampling plan of both affected and unaffected areas. NUREG/CR-5849, Manual for Conducting Radiological Surveys in Support of License Termination, is the guidance the staff uses as the basis for review of site characterization plans.

I trust this answers your immediate concern. We look forward to fruitful discussions of the concerns of the Native Americans for a Clean Environment (NACE) about remediation of this site.
