Gentlemen:

This refers to the followup Maintenance Team Inspection conducted by Messrs. P. Moore, B. Drouin, R. Mendez, and Ms. S. Burgess of this office on October 1 to October 19, 1990, of activities at Fermi 2 authorized by Facility Operating License No. NPF-43. The inspection was conducted to evaluate your progress in the area of maintenance since the Maintenance Team Inspection that was conducted in November 1989. The inspection findings were discussed with you at the conclusion of the onsite inspection on October 5, 1990. A telephone exit meeting was conducted on October 19, 1990, to communicate further findings that were resolved subsequent to the onsite exit meeting.

The enclosed copy of our inspection report identifies areas examined during the inspection. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews ith personnel. The focus of the inspection was a performance based evaluation and reassessment of those areas indicated as poor during the original Maintenance Team Inspection conducted in November 1989 and a determination of any improvement in them. Overall, you have taken positive and substantial actions to improve the maintenance program in response to past identified weaknesses. Some of these actions have already resulted in improvements, while others will require additional assessment or a longer post-implementation period to be adequately evaluated. A maintenance tree showing the team's reassessment is enclosed.

Two examples of failure to adequately document 1989 equipment testing results contrary to station procedures are described in this report. In one example, documentation of test results (July 1989) was missing, but the missing documentation appeared to be an isolated event. In the other example, unsatisfactory test results (August 1989) were not reported as required. However, appropriate corrective action was taken in response to a similar violation (November 1989) noted in an NRC inspection report (50-341/89024) subsequent to this occurrence. Therefore, we have decided not to issue a notice of violation because the violation is categorized as a Severity Level V and the criteria identified in 10 CFR 2, Appendix C, Section V.A. have been satisfied.
