I. <u>SECY-82-473 - Indian Point Special Proceeding</u>, Draft Decision on UCS Motion to Direct Staff to Reschedule Meeting

The Commission, by a vote of 4-1,* (Commissioner Gilinsky disapproving), approved an Order that grants in part and denies in part the Union of Concerned Scientists' Motion which sought to have the NRC staff reschedule a meeting.

(Subsequently, on December 23, 1982 the Order was signed by the Secretary).

II. <u>SECY-82-457</u> - Review of ALAB-687 (In the Matter of Duke Power Company, et al.)

The Commission, by a vote of 4-1,** (with Commissioner Gilinsky disapproving and Commissioner Asselstine disapproving in part), approved an Order taking partial review of ALAB-687. Commissioner Gilinsky would not have taken review and Commissioner Asselstine did not favor seeking review of the second issue specified in the Order.
