- 13. The licensee is exempted from decommissioning financial assurance requirements for possession of licensed material in sealed sources in quantities greater than the limits of 10 CFR 30.35(d) for the purpose of source changes only. This exemption is granted for no more than 30 days for any one source change.
- 14. The licensee shall maintain records of information important to safe and effective decommissioning at 2600 Sixth Street, S.W., Canton, Ohio per the provisions of 10 CFR 30.35 (g) until this license is terminated by the Commission.
- 15. In-house service operations on the AECL Theratron 780C teletherapy unit and console may be performed by David L. Hykes, M.D., Gregory Lasko, R.T.(T), Wayne R. Hedrick, Ph.D., Louis R. Milavickas, Ph.D., Vicky DiSabatino, R.T.(T) or Kathleen Schroeder R.T.(T) for those services specified in attachments to letter received April 30, 1990 (excluding item 6.C.).
- 16. Personnel monitoring shall be provided to those persons specified in Condition 15. during performance of in-house service operations on the AECL Theratron 780C teletherapy unit.
- 17. Pursuant to Section 20.105(a) of Title 10, Chapter 1, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation," and in reliance of statements, procedures and representations made by the licensee in his letter dated August 9, 1984, the following maximum radiation levels are hereby authorized in the following unrestricted areas:

<u>Maximum Radiation Level</u>	<u>Unrestricted Area</u>
12.0 milliroentgens per hour	One foot above the glass over the atrium skylight

- 18. Except as specifically provided otherwise in this license, the licensee shall conduct its program in accordance with the statements, representations, and procedures contained in the documents including any enclosures, listed below. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations shall govern unless the statements, representations and procedures in the licensee's application and correspondence are more restrictive than the regulations.
