SUBJECT: NRC BULLETIN NO. 88-11, "PRESSURIZER SURGE LINE THERMAL

STRATIFICATION" - EVALUATION FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE JUSTIFICATION FOR CONTINUED OPERATION (JCO) (TAC NO. 72128)

By letter dated November 19, 1990 (Serial No. 1873), the Toledo Edison Company requested an extension for the Justification for Continued Operation (JCO) dealing with the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1. The JCO results from requirements provided in Bulletin 88-11 addressing the thermal stratification that may exist in the Pressurizer Surge Line (PSL). In accordance with the schedular requirements of the bulletin, the final report is due January 2, 1991. Babcock and Wilcox (B&W) Owners Group reported that based on the average of three heat-up/cooldown cycles per year experienced by Davis-Besse during the past 12 year, an additional five years of continued plant operation is assured as bounded by the fatigue analysis.

The bases for the additional five years is discussed in the November 19, 1990 letter which states that the conservative fatigue analysis justifies a total of 57 heatup/cooldown cycles for a fatigue usage factor of 1.0. The plant has experienced 41 heatup/cooldown cycles to date, leaving a margin of 16 cycles before the fatigue limit is reached. Thus, the remaining cycles are sufficient to justify five additional years of operation based on an average of three heatup/cooldown cycles per year as discussed above.

Although the conservative analysis indicated that sufficient margin justifies continued operation through January 2, 1991, based on the above and the licembee is submittal, there is an adequate margin to extend the JCO well beyond the seventh fuel cycle. Specifically, it is reasonable to assume that the margin established by a very conservative analysis will not be reached for at least five years. On this basis, we find your request to extend the JCO until the startup of Cycle 8 presently scheduled for November 9, 1991 acceptable.
