The licensee declared an Unusual Event on March 7, 1983, at 2:03 p.m. The event was declared as a result of placing both Emergency Diesel Generators in an inoperable status while Unit 3 was in operational mode 3.

Technical Specifications require that each 92 days the fuel oil storage tanks be sampled and analyzed to establish that less than 2 mg of insolubles exist in 100 ml of fuel. The licensee received results indicating that the storage tank samples contained 2.0 mg and 2.9 mg per 100 ml, respectively. The licensee took immediate action to place the Unit in mode 5, as required.

The licensee feels that a bad sample was obtained since no new fuel was added to the tanks and the results of the previous analysis were on the order of two orders of magnitude less than the specified 2 mg per 100 ml. Action has been initiated to resample and reanalyze.

The diesel manufacturer contends that the observed level of insolubles is not a critical parameter in the diesel design.

Media interest is not expected. Neither the licensee nor the NRC plans to issue a news release. Region V (San Francisco) received notification of this occurrence from the Resident Inspector at about 2:15 p.m. on March 7, 1983. This information is current as of 4:15 p.m. on March 7, 1983.
