ON MEDICAL USES OF ISOTOPES (Pursuant to Section 9 of Public Law 92-463)

1. Advisory Committee on Medical Uses of Isotopes:

2. Committee's objectives, scope of activities and duties are as follows:

The Committee provides advice, as requested by the Director, Division of Industrial and Medical Nuclear Safety, Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards, with respect to the development of standards and criteria for regulating and licensing uses of radionuclides in human subjects. The appointed Chairman of the Committee will conduct all meetings and will write a report which will summarize each meeting. The report will include the Committee's recommendations for future actions. Subcommittees may be convened to address specific problems when it is not necessary for the full Committee to be present.


