Dear Mr. Chairman:

The NRC has sent to the Office of the Federal Register for publication the enclosed denial of a petition for rulemaking submitted by the New England Coalition on Nuclear Pollution, Inc. The petitioner requested that the NRC amend its regulations regarding waste classification of low-level radioactive waste to restrict the number and types of waste streams which can be disposed of in near-surface disposal facilities. The petitioner asserts that significant new information in three critical areas has been developed since the current rules were promulgated -- revised international and national guidance on dose limits, consideration of the potential consequences of deliberate intrusion into the low-level waste disposal facility, and presumed reduced cost differentials between shallow-land disposal and geologic disposal, require a supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

The petition is being denied for the following reasons. First, the petitioner is proposing an inappropriate application of dose limits recommended by international and national standards organizations to the consideration of inadvertent intrusion. Second, the petitioner has not provided adequate information to justify consideration of "deliberate" intrusion as a basis for waste classification. The NRC continues to believe, as stated in the EIS, that protection against deliberate intrusion would be unnecessarily conservative and unwarranted. Finally, a supplemental EIS is not needed since the petitioner has provided no new information relative to the disposal of low-level waste.
