

REPLY TO A NOTICE OF VIOLATION

This correspondence is in response to a Notice of Violation dated April 19, 1994, Docket No. 150-00003. As discussed with the inspector, Mr. J. Mumper on March 29,1994 during a telephone conversation, the Model 4000 ammonia analyzer is secured in a locked cabinet which at the time of inspection was unlocked for display by a testing company which was on site. The cabinet was to be secured at the end of the work day by a Cogentrix employee and was to remain locked until the return of the licensee.

Since the time of inspection, the cabinet has remained secured except under the direct supervision of the licensee. A key to the access doors of the cabinet has been left in the possession of Mr. Gene McGhan at the Cogentrix facilities for reasons of safety. A voltage output from the Model 4000 has been provided to the Cogentrix control room to eliminate the need for access to the cabinet.
