Dear Mr. Hukill:

In its March 23, 1981 Order (CLI-81-3), the Commission indicated among other things, that the Commission itself would consider the need for granting deferral of the licensee's implementation dates for NUREG-0737 requirements on TMI-1 until after restart, where such deferral is consistent with implementation schedules for other operating reactors. The Commission also noted that it would do so only after considering staff recommendations on this subject. Since the ASLB initial decision is now complete and before the Commission for determination as to whether it should be made immediately effective, it is now appropriate to consider the need for any deferral of NUREG-0737 requirements on TMI-1.

Accordingly, we request that you submit current schedules for implementation of presently incomplete NUREG-0737 items. For any item whose NUREG-0737 schedule implementation date falls due before your estimated date of plant restart and which you will be unable to complete prior to restart, provide a revised commitment and sufficient justification in terms of details of procurement or other problems, compensating measures, and acceptability of plant operation without the completed item. The staff intends to evaluate each item individually and determine whether you have exhibited a good faith effort to comply with the requirement by the schedule specified in NUREG-0737 and have shown good cause for needing a delay. We request that you provide your response no later than September 10 so that we can be prepared to provide our recommendations to the Commission by late September. Where appropriate, reference may be made to your previous submittals in response to Generic Letters 82-05 and 82-10 although justification for delays provided in those responses may not be sufficient. Since this information request is being sent to fewer than ten respondents, OMB clearance is not required under P. L. 96-511.
