Subject: Comments Supporting Exemption of State-Owned Research Reactors from Annual Fees (10CFR171.11)

Dear Sir:

I am writing to you as chair of the Physics Department at the University of Rhode Island to express our support of the proposed exemption from annual fees for state-owned research reactors as proposed in the Federal Register dated May 10, 1994. One of the reasons for the exemption is benefit to educational institutions.

The Physics Department at the University of Rhode Island has been one of the recipients of such benefits and through it, the undergraduate and the graduate students. Also, over the years thousands of high school physics students from Rhode Island and its vicinity have participated in the educational tour of the Rhode Island Nuclear Science Center (which houses the research reactor).

The research done at the reactor by the department has been substantially unfunded and has resulted in a number of master's, Ph.D. and senior theses. It has and continues to be of great benefit to all students in all curriculae.

We believe that such an exemption is very much in the spirit of supporting future generations in their quest for modern education and enriching society.
