By letter dated January 25, 1983 you submitted TMI Training Manual Procedure No. 6210-ADM-1340.05 Operator Training Instructor Indoctrination/Qualification Training Program for our review and certification as required by the ASLB Partial Initial Decision of July 27, 1982, paragraph 2347.2. We have reviewed the procedure against the ASLB criteria set forth in paragraph 2347.2 and against appropriate criteria of NUREG-0737 "Clarification of TMI Action Plan Requirements". We find that we need additional information to complete our review. Our comments are contained in the enclosure.

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TMI-1 RESTART CERTIFICATION
REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION
QUALIFICATION OF INSTRUCTORS

A. Knowledge of Subject Taught

Our review in this area indicates that the GPU procedures provide for several levels of technical qualifications. These include:

1. Instructors for Non-Licensed Operator Training
2. Instructors for Licensed Operator/STA Training
3. Those who teach "Systems and Components, Transients and Integrated Plant Response, Operating Procedures, Simulator Training."

The technical qualifications are established by having an SRO license or certification or by satisfactory completion of training or education in subjects. The staff position is that the SRO license or certification should be for the TMI-1 plant. Additional information (including course objectives, student text, classroom presentation, and method of testing) is necessary to evaluate those training programs which allow alternate means of qualification.

B. Skills in Presentation of Knowledge

More information is necessary to determine the objectives of the Basic Instructor Development School; also, how these objectives are applied to obtain an interim certification.

C. Preparation and Administration of Examinations

Additional information is necessary to review this area. We believe this information may be contained in other GPU documents and procedures which are referenced in Attachment 1 of the GPU procedure.

We also need information to determine if the GPU procedures apply for contractor or vendor provided instruction.
