In accordance with Rancho Seco Nuclear Generating Station Technical Specifications, Section 6.9.4.2.c, and Regulatory Guide 1.16, Section C.2.b(3), the Sacramento Municipal Utility District hereby submits a 30-day report of Licensee Event Report No. 82-24.

On August 18, 1982, it was reported that supports for a Class I cable raceway were cut back and temporary supports attached to permit access for new cable trays being run in the area. It appears that on July 19, 1982, supports H-983 and H-984 were cut back. Apparently, the foreman in the area believed that this was acceptable. Work in this area was completed on August 11, and a construction inspector noticed the temporary supports on August 13. Up to this time, the plant was in cold shutdown. The design engineer was notified of the problem, the NCR dispositioned, and a permanent fix was begun on the 18th. Work was completed and signed off at 3:00 p.m., August 19th. During the period from July 19th to August 19th, therefore, the raceway's support did not have seismic calculations or details to justify these supports.

Subsequent corrective action was to inform all Electrical General Foremen and Electrical Foremen that they must have a specific Work Request to remove or relocate any existing raceways, supports, braces, or other items affecting the safety of the plant.

A review of the raceway's circuit contents shows that only channel B safeguards were located in the tray. Attached is a list of affected circuits.

The Management Safety Review Committee will consider this event at their next meeting. A follow-up report to this LER will be provided when the District's investigation of this matter is complete. This report will provide additional details.
