Subject: STOLEN ASPHALT CONTENT GAUGE

Florida, an Agreement State, notified Region II at 8:45 a.m. on August 5, 1993 that a radioactive device was stolen from a vehicle in Miami, Florida on August 4, 1993 at 5:15 p.m. The device was stolen from a vehicle (Overnight Transportation Trucking Co.) while being delivered to a freight forwarding company, Jamacol International, Miami, Florida.

The device was an Asphalt Content Gauge, Troxler model 3241c, serial number 1976, containing 100 millicuries of americium-241/beryllium. The device is a laboratory model weighing about 70 pounds and using 110 volt r — supply. The transport case normally has a radiation profile of 3.9

rem maximum at the surface and 0.1 millirem at one meter. The device has a maximum reading at the surface of 11 millirem per hour from neutron and gamma radiation combined.

Local authorities and the FBI have been notified and the local police are conducting an investigation.

A local press release is expected.

This information is all that is known at 10:30 a.m., August 5, 1993.
