NOTICE OF VIOLATION

During an NRC inspection conducted on April 13 and May 12, 1994, violations of NRC requirements were identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, the violations are listed below:

- A. 10 CFR 39.13(d) requires, in part, that an applicant establish and submit to the Commission its program for annual inspections on-the-job performance of each logging supervisor.

License Condition 16 incorporates the inspection program containing the requirements of 10 CFR 39.13(d) as submitted in the licensee's application dated April 20, 1990, and letter dated February 19, 1993.

Letter dated February 19, 1993, requires that a record of each logging supervisor's annual job performance evaluation be retained and a copy forwarded to the Radiation Safety Department office.

Contrary to the above, as of April 13, 1994, records of annual job performance inspections conducted for seven logging supervisors who had worked at Yukon, Oklahoma; Woodward, Oklahoma; North Slope, Alaska; and Mt. Pleasant, Michigan, for calendar years 1991, 1992, and 1993, were not available for inspection.

This is a Severity Level V violation (Supplement VI).

- B. 10 CFR 39.61(d) requires, in part, that the licensee maintain a record on each logging supervisor's and logging assistant's training and annual safety reviews for 3 years.

Contrary to the above, as of April 13, 1994, records of safety reviews for seven logging supervisors who had worked at North Slope, Alaska; Mt. Pleasant, Michigan; Woodward, Oklahoma; and Rock Springs, Wyoming, for calendar years 1992 and 1993, were not available for inspection.

This is a Severity Level V violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Western Atlas International is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, D.C. 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region IV, 611 Ryan Plaza Drive, Suite 400, Arlington, Texas 76011, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and

the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or a Demand for Information may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.
