This refers to your letter of May 25, 1994, requesting review and approval of your revised Port Operating Plan for the Port of Baltimore, Maryland (designated MASTS-103, Revised May 1994).

Savannah (defueled) can be towed, berthed, and drydocked as proposed in and near Baltimore, Maryland, without undue risk to the health and safety of the public.

If modifications to the Port Operating Plan for the Port of Baltimore, Maryland, as approved herein, are contemplated, a new port operating plan should be submitted. Approval of this plan does not amend the present requirements of the Technical Specifications.
