RESOLUTION OF SUFFOLK COUNTY CONTENTION
EP 6 -- TRAINING

THIS AGREEMENT by and among Long Island Lighting Company ("LILCO"), the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Staff ("Staff"), Suffolk County ("SC"), the Shoreham Opponents Coalition ("SOC"), and the North Shore Committee ("NSC") (hereinafter collectively the "Parties") resolves Suffolk County Contention EP 6 in accordance with the terms stated below, subject to the approval of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board ("Licensing Board").

Suffolk County Contention EP 6 concerns training of emergency personnel from offsite agencies in the vicinity of the Shoreham Nuclear Power Station that are expected to respond in the event of a radiological emergency at Shoreham. Suffolk County has contended that LILCO has not provided adequate training to offsite emergency response personnel.

By this Resolution agreement, LILCO represents to the County, and the County has confirmed, that the Wading River

Fire Department, which will provide fire fighting and ambulance services in the event of an emergency, has been trained in accordance with the provisions of the LILCO Emergency Plan. In addition, prior to fuel load, LILCO will notify in writing through the Wading River Fire Department (with a copy to the County) all other Primary Mutual Aid fire departments of the availability of training by LILCO and to furnish the training in accordance with the provisions of the LILCO Emergency Plan. LILCO agrees to furnish to the County on a regular basis information with respect to which fire districts and ambulance services (and what personnel within those organizations) have received training, and when refresher courses are due and provided for all trained personnel. LILCO will also provide confirmatory information to the County on a regular basis that training will be made available to all new fire fighting and ambulance personnel within a reasonable time upon entering the service of such organizations.

Accordingly, based upon LILCO's commitment to train offsite emergency response personnel, the County finds that SC contention EP 6 is resolved.^{1/} As a result, the Parties jointly

^{1/} In resolving contention EP 6 as part of the Phase I Contentions, the County does not waive the right to raise any claims it may have in connection with the training that the County may wish LILCO to undertake in accordance with the County's emergency plan; nor shall the resolution of this contention EP 6 prejudice in any way the County's contention concerning the role-conflict of emergency workers as set forth in contention EP 5(A).

urge the Licensing Board to accept this Resolution to terminate litigation of SC Contention EP 6.
