In a telephone conversation on June 8, 1994 between Mr. M. Hall, Training Supervisor, and Mr. M. Bielby, Principal Examiner, arrangements were made for the administration of one initial license retake examination of Job Performance Measures (JPMs) for a reactor operator at the Fermi 2 Nuclear Plant who previously demonstrated unsatisfactory performance of JPMs during the initial license examination on December 10, 1994.

The JPM retake examination is scheduled for the week of August 29, 1994. Your staff will be given an opportunity to review the JPM examination in accordance with the guidelines in Revision 7 of NUREG-1021, "Operator Licensing Examiner Standards," (ES-201, Attachment 4) during the week of August 29, 1994.

To prepare the examination and meet the above schedule, it will be necessary for your staff to furnish the reference materials identified in Attachment 2 of ES-201 by July 27, 1994, or as modified by the Chief Examiner and agreed to by your training staff. Any delay in receiving approved and indexed reference material or the submittal of inadequate or incomplete reference material may result in the examinations being rescheduled.

The NRC will prepare and administer the JPM examination in accordance with ES-301 and ES-302 of NUREG-1021. In order to conduct the requested JPM examination, it will be necessary for your staff to make the simulation facility available on the dates noted above. Your staff should retain the original simulator performance data (e.g., system pressures, temperatures, and levels) generated during the JPM examination until the results are final.

ES-302, Attachment 1, contains a number of NRC policies and guidelines that will be in effect while the JPM examination is being administered.

The signed re-application should be submitted at least 14 days before the examination date.

This request is covered by Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Clearance Number 3150-0101, which expires October 31, 1995. The estimated average burden is 7.7 hours per response, including gathering, xeroxing and mailing the required material. Send comments regarding this burden estimate or any
