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## Chairman's Comments on SECY-93-259

While I generally agree with Commissioner de Planque's comments regarding revising the Abnormal Occurrence (AO) examples, I support Commissioner Rogers' specific proposals concerning the long-term and near-term approaches to the AO reporting issue.

Specifically, I vote to:

- (1) Approve Option 2 as described in SECY-93-259 as the approach to developing criteria to determine if an event should be reported to Congress as an abnormal occurrence;
- (2) Make all of the revisions to conform the Abnormal Occurrence examples to the amended 10 CFR Part 20 at the same time as the amendments regarding medical misadministrations, rather than making them in two stages as the staff has proposed;
- (3) Develop criteria for reporting, in Appendix C of the AO reports to Congress, events involving human exposures in unrestricted areas that exceed regulatory limits, but would no longer be catego-ized as AOs; and
- (4) Continue to conduct AO reporting with the existing Commission Policy Statement until public comments have been received and resolved on any proposed revision.
